TLC LICENSING RULES UPDATE

The Livery Roundtable ("LRT") continues to strive to keep its members and the industry up to date on legal, regulatory and other issue effecting the for hire vehicle industry and small businesses in general.

The New York City Taxi and Limousine Commission ("TLC") recently reviewed its rules on how applicants obtain and renew their TLC licenses. As a result of this review, the TLC is considering simplifying a number of rules. The proposed amendments would make it easier to own and operate a taxi or for-hire vehicle without compromising safety and consumer protections.

The proposed rules involve and will effect the following issues

- 1. Renewing Expired Driver and Vehicle Licenses;
- 2. Experienced Driver Education Exemption;
- 3. Taxi Vehicle Hardship Extension Requests;
- 4. Commuter Van Amendments
