NOTICE: New Driver Pay Rates On Hold Pending Outcome of Uber Lawsuit

33 Beaver Street 22nd Floor New York, NY 10004 The New York City Taxi and Limousine Commission (TLC) approved changes to its driver pay rules on November 15, 2022, raising the minimum rates of pay for drivers working for High-Volume For-Hire Services (Lyft & Uber). As announced in Industry Notice #22-03, these increased minimum pay rates were scheduled to take effect on December 19, 2022. However, Uber filed a lawsuit seeking to strike down the new driver pay standards and successfully petitioned a judge to halt the new rates from becoming effective until further judicial action is taken.

Accordingly, no new pay rates will go into effect for High Volume For-Hire Service drivers on December 19, 2022. Drivers should refer to the existing pay rates effective March 01, 2022, which can be found on the TLC's website.
